There are a wide range of roles in which professionals with a doctoral degree in education may work, including—but not limited to—positions such as\*:

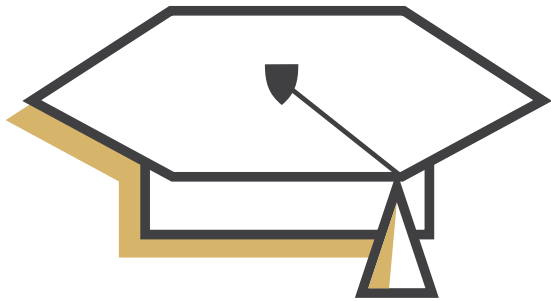

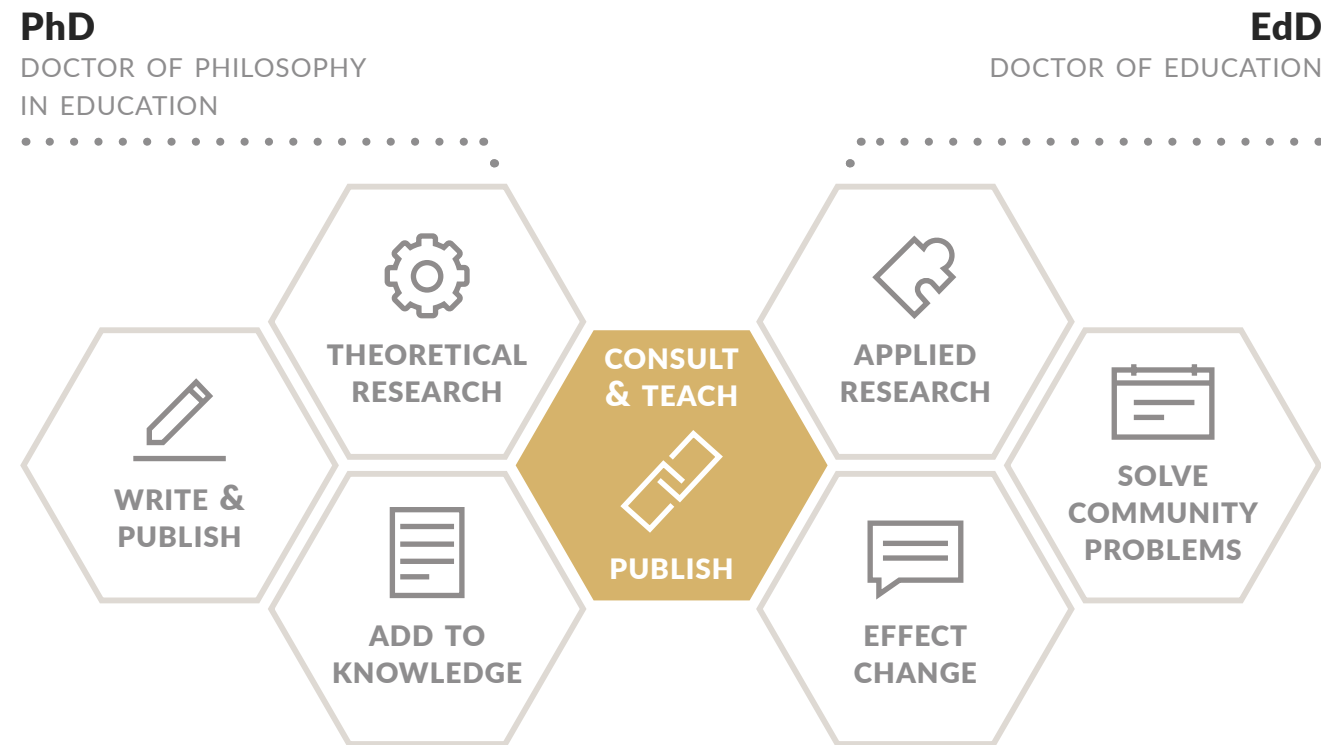

## PhD vs. EdD: How Does a PhD Differ from an EdD?

It's often thought that a PhD prepares you to teach at the college or university level, while an EdD is geared more toward a career in administration or leadership role, such as building instructional coach or supervising teacher.

However, the best doctoral programs equip both PhD and EdD students with a deep understanding of foundational theory and how it directly applies to the current and future needs of their profession. Graduates of either program will gain the skills and knowledge to help them become outstanding leaders, researchers, teachers, and consultants in the field.



**The one primary difference between PhD and EdD programs is the type of research conducted in the independent research phase.**

# PhD vs. EdD: Dissertation vs. Capstone

## DISSERTATION

PhD students are expected to **extend the body of knowledge** in the field of education to solve for a real-world problem. This is demonstrated through a dissertation.

A dissertation addresses a new research problem, or a gap in existing research, that will contribute to the knowledge base of the discipline.

VS

## CAPSTONE

EdD students are expected to **apply existing knowledge** in the field of education to a real-world problem in their workplace or community. At Capella, this is demonstrated through a capstone project.

Unlike the dissertation, the capstone deliverable can take on many different forms—an applied dissertation, paper, product, or portfolio. Whatever the form, this doctoral project is intended to extend or apply research to immediately deliver a solution to a real-world challenge in the educational space.





## PhD vs. EdD: Time and Cost

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The full cost and time to earn either type of doctoral degree depends on many variables. Some of the variables may include:

### **COURSE LOAD:**

How many courses will you take each quarter?

### **RESIDENCIES:**

Does your program have in-person residency requirements?  
Cost of attendance varies according to program and may include tuition and travel expenses, along with lodging and meals.

### **COMPREHENSIVE EXAMS:**

Required for PhD students; costs vary according to program and may include resource fees for library access.

### **DISSERTATION OR CAPSTONE:**

The time required for completion of this independent research is highly variable depending on program requirements, individual pace of progress, and the type of research.

### **TRANSFER CREDITS:**

Do you have any that can count toward your program?

### **BOOKS:**

Where will you get your books? Are some available as eBooks, which are generally a lower cost?

### **OTHER EXPENSES:**

Will you have to pay for childcare while you study?  
Will you have to invest in a new computer?

**Given all of these factors, a conversation with your enrollment counselor can help you determine what your time and cost may be.**

## PhD vs. EdD: Which Degree is Right for You?

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Ultimately, deciding whether to pursue a PhD or EdD should start with knowing your career goals, how you plan to apply your degree, and what kind of research most interests you.

Use these questions to guide your self-reflection on what you see yourself doing in the short and long term.

**What are your career goals?**

**Where do you see yourself in 5 years? In 20 years?**

**Who could you connect with to hear more about the jobs you're interested in?**

**Where do you hope to apply your learning?**

**What type of research do you want to do?**

**Which degree is required or expected for the kind of jobs you want to pursue?**

**Are you interested in consulting, now or in the future?**



# Education Doctoral Degree Options: K-12 Teaching and Leadership

## **EdD IN READING AND LITERACY**

PRIMARY FOCUS: INCREASE READING COMPETENCIES AT A K-12 LEVEL.

Learn the foundations of reading and writing processes and best practices to evaluate reading and writing instruction. In addition to online coursework, K-12 field experiences provide opportunities to apply newly-acquired knowledge in diverse educational settings.

## **SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:**

- Evaluate needs and measuring results.
- Provide administrative leadership.
- Assess student outcomes.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include reading specialist, coordinator of reading or literacy program, adult basic education director, curriculum specialist, program administrator, and education policy specialist.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: K-12 Teaching and Leadership

## PhD IN CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

PRIMARY FOCUS: DEVELOP AND EVALUATE K-12 CURRICULA.

This program focuses on developing and demonstrating the research-based knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary for effective classroom-, building-, and district-level leadership in curriculum and instruction.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Lead in curriculum and instruction.
- Collaborate for the improvement of curriculum and instruction.
- Develop curricula reflecting the local philosophy and mission, professional research, current trends, and community and societal needs.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include director of assessment, director of instruction, instructional specialist, superintendent, curriculum specialist, and adjunct, part-time, or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: K-12 Teaching and Leadership

## PhD IN LEADERSHIP IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION

PRIMARY FOCUS: DEVELOP SKILLS FOR EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP AS A PRINCIPAL OR SUPERINTENDENT.

This program is aligned with nationally recognized leadership standards and designed to develop and strengthen the knowledge, skills, attributes, and dispositions needed to lead an educational system. Doctoral students can choose between focused tracks in School Leadership or District Leadership.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Advance the field of education through influence.
- Lead the development of a culture of learning.
- Facilitate the development of a shared vision of learning.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include school leadership, such as principal, assistant principal, and director of student services; and district leadership, such as superintendent, assistant superintendent, and director of instructional technology.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: K-12 Teaching and Leadership

## PhD IN SPECIAL EDUCATION LEADERSHIP

PRIMARY FOCUS: LEAD SPECIAL EDUCATION INITIATIVES WITHIN SCHOOLS OR IN GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.

This program is aligned with nationally recognized standards and focuses on K-12 special education leadership skills, including knowledge of laws and regulations, curriculum and instruction, financial resources, and community and family collaboration. (You must hold a master's degree in education and a certification or license in special education.)

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Manage effective learning environments in special education.
- Facilitate the development of a shared vision of learning for special education.
- Promote the success of all persons.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include executive director of special education, special education consultant, disabilities and mental health services manager, director of therapeutic recreation, special education teacher, and adjunct, part-time or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## EdD IN ADULT EDUCATION

PRIMARY FOCUS: LEAD IN ADULT EDUCATION SETTINGS.

Doctoral students learn how to provide effective leadership in a variety of adult education settings, including colleges, universities, corporations, nonprofits, and governmental educational organizations. This program will strengthen inquiry, analysis, communication, decision-making, and leadership skills and then apply them to address critical, real-world problems.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Evaluate information literacy and technology in adult learning settings and contexts.
- Lead the teaching and learning process in adult learning settings and contexts.
- Facilitate communication and collaboration in adult learning settings and contexts.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include dean, provost, academic affairs vice president, director of grant writing, community college president, and director of training and development.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## **EdD IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP**

PRIMARY FOCUS: DRIVE CHANGE IN EDUCATION SETTINGS.

This program prepares doctoral students to lead and affect change. Professionals in this program are typically educators transitioning into administrative leadership positions looking to broaden their leadership and managerial capabilities.

## **SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:**

- Lead and manage change and innovation in an educational setting.
- Lead and manage the development of information literacy and technology in an educational setting.
- Lead and manage a culture of learning which addresses diversity, inclusion, and equity in an educational setting.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include K-12 education such as program director, curriculum director, and district assessment coordinator; and higher education, such as president, provost, and director of admissions.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## **EdD IN PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT LEADERSHIP**

PRIMARY FOCUS: IMPACT ORGANIZATIONAL PERFORMANCE.

This degree is designed for experienced professionals who wish to take on leadership roles in the area of human performance improvement. The curriculum is based on standards and models from the Association of Talent Development (ATD) and the International Society for Performance Improvement (ISPI).

## **SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:**

- Assess human performance systems.
- Select and design interventions to improve performance.
- Lead performance improvement processes and initiatives.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include chief learning officer, corporate training specialist, director of training and education, performance improvement consultant, distance education specialist, and adjunct, part-time, or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## **EdD IN CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

PRIMARY FOCUS: LEAD CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION INITIATIVES.

This program is designed for teachers and administrators interested in leadership careers as building- or district-level administrators, or as teacher-leaders guiding curriculum and instructional improvement initiatives. Doctoral students will gain skills in curriculum design, instructional models, and assessment strategies focused on increasing student achievement.

## **SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:**

- Lead in curriculum, instruction, and assessment.
- Evaluate current and future information technology to facilitate the curriculum, instruction, and assessment mission.
- Evaluate the implementation of curriculum, instruction, and assessment for continuous improvement.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include director of assessment, director of instruction, curriculum director, superintendent, distance education specialist, and adjunct, part-time or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## PHD IN POST-SECONDARY AND ADULT EDUCATION

PRIMARY FOCUS: DEVELOP SKILLS AND QUALIFICATIONS TO TEACH IN AN ADULT EDUCATION SETTING.

This program is designed to enhance knowledge, skills, and qualifications in adult education in a variety of settings. The curriculum concentrates on theories of adult learning and distance education, critical analysis and research skills, best practices in post-secondary adult instruction, and the application of theory and research.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Facilitate the learning process for adults.
- Provide vision and direction in adult serving post-secondary education and community settings.
- Perform relevant, high quality, scholarly research.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include dean, provost, community college president, academic affairs vice president, director of training and development, and adjunct, part-time, or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## PhD IN LEADERSHIP FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

PRIMARY FOCUS: PREPARE FOR LEADERSHIP IN HIGHER EDUCATION SETTINGS.

This program focuses on the knowledge and critical-thinking skills to lead post-secondary education organizations. Doctoral students engage in a curriculum that emphasizes leadership theories and models; higher education history, politics, and law; assessment; funding and financing; human resource management and administration; and the future of teaching and learning.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Lead and manage change in higher education organizations.
- Develop and manage resources of higher education organizations.
- Value and promote diversity, equity, and globalization for academic excellence.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include president, provost, faculty development director, dean of student affairs, dean of external relations, and adjunct, part-time, or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## PHD IN INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN FOR ONLINE LEARNING

PRIMARY FOCUS: DEVELOP INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN SKILLS FOR ONLINE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS.

Doctoral students explore instructional design management in a variety of traditional and online settings, including educational institutions, corporations, and government agencies. The curriculum emphasizes research and leadership in instructional design, development, and implementation.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Contribute to the enrichment of the instructional design and development discipline, the broader scholarly community, and society through research in instructional design and development.
- Lead instructional design organizations, and work groups.
- Lead strategic instructional design initiatives.

**RELATED JOB TITLES TO EXPLORE\*** include dean of distance education, vice president of education services, director of knowledge solutions, director of e-learning, director of instructional design, and adjunct, part-time, or full-time faculty of education courses.

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# Education Doctoral Degree Options: Higher Education

## PhD IN NURSING EDUCATION

PRIMARY FOCUS: PREPARE TO TEACH THE NEXT GENERATION OF NURSES.

This program trains nurses for advanced roles as nurse educators in higher and adult education. The curriculum includes such topics as advanced nursing theory and concepts, curriculum design and evaluation, teaching strategies, and classroom assessment.

## SAMPLES OF ASSOCIATED SKILLS INCLUDE:

- Facilitate learner development and socialization.
- Participate in curriculum design and evaluation of program outcomes.
- Function as a change agent and leader.

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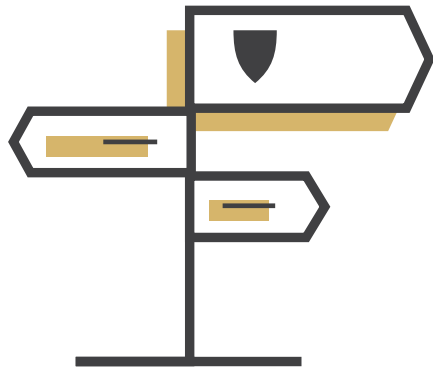
