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So the first thing you do in a class is you look at the calendar and pick out what dates you're going to complete your assignments, which is really helpful if you're a nurse or just a busy human because you know we all need some flexibility in our schedules.

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Next, you click on your first "assessment" is what they're called and you would look at the instructions and there's usually like a quick quiz or something to do with the assignment. It doesn't really impact your grade as much in these kinds of courses as a typical undergrad course. It's mainly just for completion and inform attendance and then the main assignment will be the thing at the very bottom.

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So a lot of papers are what your assignments will be when you're in a bachelor's program and so the papers that we're typically writing are on different types of concepts such as how can we integrate all of the types of health care workers to be a better team and to tackle xyz problems in our community and health care and the one I just finished writing was on nursing informatics, which is something that I can leverage my experience as a nurse with because we work with nursing informatics.

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My hospital currently changed hospital charting systems so I was like in working with nursing informatic. Informaticist I think is what they're called, actually, a nurse informaticist, an NI. So I wrote a whole paper about their role which was a lot easier when you've actually had the experience and worked with one, and that is the benefit of being a nurse while being in these bachelor level classes is that your experience in the health care field also helps you and doubles up as, you know, meat, so to speak for your papers and really it just comes altogether to enhance your education.
